



Kreg Llewellyn - ATHLETE 2017 Hall of Fame Inductee

Kreg Llewellyn is one of Canada's most successful skiers of all time. His respect for the Overall Crown ran deep because he always wanted to be the ultimate warrior. Kreg was an innovator in all aspects but because of his raw athletic ability, the trick event would never be the same. Kreg was willing to try anything and re-inventing was a daily routine. He re-molded the step overs and was the first to perform what we now know as body overs. He helped design and test the first ever Skurfer, which was the pre-cursor to the evolution of wakeboarding. He won the first ever World Wakeboard Championships in Hawaii. At the 1991 World's he was a mere decimal 2 short of the Overall Crown, but his two individual event medals helped Canada top the undefeated US Team for the first time.
